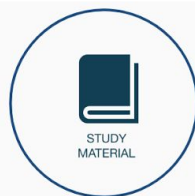

Speakers

Dr. Joan Barata Mir

Dr. Joan Barata Mir is founder and consultant in *CommVisions*, as well as legal consultant of the *Albany Associates Ltd.* He is also associated researcher at the Central University de Budapest and the Annenberg Communications School of Pennsylvania University.

He has been Senior Advisor to the Representative on Freedom of the Media of the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe (OSCE).

Dr. Barata has held various positions and taught at universities in Spain, United Kingdom, Italy, Russia and other countries, as well as published books and articles in the field of freedom of expression, media and communications regulation, electronic commerce and intellectual property. He has been head of the Cabinet of President and secretary general of the Audiovisual Council of Catalonia. He has advised in the areas of his specialty to various international organizations and in several countries of the world, including Thailand, Morocco, Tunisia, Lebanon, Jordan, Albania, Hungary, Dominican Republic, Colombia, Ecuador and the United States.



Dr. Arnold Kammel

Arnold Kammel studied Law and Political Science in Graz, Vienna and Alcalá de Henares (Madrid) and holds a Doctor of Law degree of the University of Graz. He obtained a Master of Arts in Business from the University of Applied Sciences in Eisenstadt. In 2004 Arnold Kammel became a research fellow at the Austrian Institute for European and Security Policy (AIES). From 2007-2014, Arnold Kammel served as the Secretary General of the AIES. Since 2015, he has been Director of the AIES.

Before joining the AIES he was a research fellow at the Institute of Austrian, European and Comparative Public Law and Political Science at the Karl-Franzens-University of Graz.

Arnold Kammel is also Vice-President of the Atlantic Treaty Association in Brussels. He teaches regularly on European and security topics at the University of Applied Sciences in Eisenstadt as well as the Theresan Military Academy in Wiener Neustadt.



His research covers the topic European integration (focusing on EU foreign, security and defence policy) as well as EU Governance and transatlantic relations.

Billy Batware

Mr. Batware completed his BA in Diplomatic Studies and MA in International Security – Peace and Conflict Studies in Austria. He is currently doing his PhD research in the governance of international development cooperation in Vienna. Billy is also the Program Coordinator for the Regional Academy on the United Nations – RAUN – since 2012; President of United for Education and Sustainable Futures – UESF since 2011; and member of the Academic Council on United Nations System – ACUNS Vienna. He is an invited lecturer of conflict and development at different universities in Eastern Europe.



Billy is also a certified trainer since October, 2014. Areas of expertise Conflict management and conflict analysis, intervention design, post-conflict institutional rebuilding, peacebuilding, program development and management, organizational development, leadership, negotiation, mediation, and entrepreneurship. Geographic experience Rwanda, Burundi, Democratic Republic of Congo – DRC, Kenya, Zimbabwe, South Africa, United Kingdom, Austria, Croatia.

Mag. Dr. Gunther Hauser

A graduated of the Faculty of Political Science and Sociology at the University of Innsbruck, Dr. Gunther Hauser received his M.A. in Political Science/International Law and his Ph.D. in Political Science/Austrian Politics at the University of Salzburg. Since 1994, he has served in various scientific, political, and military institutions. In 1997, he became a research assistant at the Committee of Foreign Affairs, Human Rights, Common Security and Defence Policy and at the Committee of Transport and Tourism of the European Parliament in Brussels and Strasbourg. From 1998 to 2000, he worked as a senior researcher and general manager at the Austrian Institute for European Security Policy (AIES) in Vienna and Maria Enzersdorf-Südstadt. During this period, Dr. Hauser was also a member of the 1998 NATO Workshop staff coordinating the programme at the Vienna Hofburg.



Since 2000, he has been a senior researcher and lecturer of European security policy and international law at the Institute for Strategy and Security Policy at the Austrian Defence Academy in Vienna, and has headed its Section of International Security since 2010.

He has published 27 books and more than 250 articles in 15 countries about European security architecture, transatlantic relations, security policy and international law, neutrality, Chinese foreign and security policy, and the Austrian parliamentary system. Since 2002, he has been writing as a permanent journalist for Austrian military newspapers (*Oesterreichische Militaerische Zeitschrift*, *Truppendienst*, *Der Soldat*). Dr. Hauser is member of ECSA Austria (European Community Studies Association) and the Presseclub Concordia (Austrian Press Club) in Vienna. From 2004 to 2009, he was the Director for International Relations at the Duesseldorf Institute for Foreign and Security Policy. In 2006, Dr. Hauser began lecturing at the Center for European Integration at Danube University Krems and was appointed Vice President of the Scientific Forum on International Security at the German Armed Forces Command and Staff College in Hamburg. Since 2014, he has held the title of honorary professor and member of the scientific board of the Department for Business Law and European Integration at Danube University Krems, Austria.
